The President called the meeting to order at 3.00 pm. As there was no quorum, the meeting was adjourned for half an hour and /called to order again at 3.30 pm, in accordance with the constitution.

OPENING REMARKS

In his opening address, the President briefed members of the College on the activities of the past year. He informed the House that the College was active in providing CME programmes for its members. However, due to the many CME activities organised by other medical organisations/societies, the College's CME Update programme held on Friday evenings were very poorly attended.

During the past year, the House was informed that the College was active in the various Sub-Committees. The College participated in several MOH and SMA activities.

Undergraduate Teaching Committee

The Undergraduate Teaching Committee had continued to work closely with the Department of Community, Occupational and Family Medicine (COFM), NUS in the undergraduate programme.

Family Medicine Teaching Programme

The modular programmes of the Family Medicine Teaching Programme were conducted as a tripartite activity with Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan, Department of COFM, NUS, as its Course Director. Chairman said that the National Skin Centre (NSC) had officially written to the NUS, School of Postgraduate Medical Studies that it was unable to take doctors for their monthly postings.

MOH and SMA activities

The College, participated in the following Ministry of Health Committees: the *National Medical Ethics Committee, Medical Advisory Committee, Workgroup on Concept Plan for Primary Health Care in Year 2020* and *Advertisement by the Medical Profession*. The College also participated in the *SMA Guideline on Consultation Fees (GOF) 3rd Edition* and the *SMA Committee on Medical Ethics Code*.

Finance

The House was informed that the College's financial status was healthy with a surplus of S\$60, 349. The College's total fund currently stood at S\$ 913, 622 compared to S\$841, 917 in 1995.

Chairman informed the House that the following important issues were to be discussed at this Annual General Meeting :

- * Possibility of compulsory CME
- * Health Minister's offer of granting statutory powers to the College
- * Expiry of College's lease with MOH
- * College's 25th Anniversary

Possibility of Compulsory CME

The House was informed that owing to the very poor response of doctors' CME attendances, Health Minister, Brigadier-General George Yeo, was keen to make CME compulsory. Chairman was informed by both Dr Richard Ng and Dr Soh Cheow Beng, who represented the College in the SMC-CME Committee, that Prof Lee Hin Peng, Chairman, SMC-CME Committee would be making recommendations and proposals to the SMC to make CME compulsory. Logistics and procedural details and punitive measures on failures to achieve the required CME points for the compulsory CME would be worked out later by the SMC-CME Committee.

Health Minister's Offer of Granting Statutory Powers to the College

Chairman informed the House that during the recent visit to the College by Health Minister, Brigadier-General George Yeo, he had recognised the efforts and work done by the College. The Health Minister had proposed the possibility of granting of statutory powers to the College. Chairman said that this statutory powers had both its advantages and disadvantages. The advantages of having statutory powers were that the financial position and premises of the College would be taken care of; the disadvantages were that the College would be managed by a Committee appointed by the Government.

Expiry of College's Lease with MOH

The House was informed that the College's lease with the MOH would expire in March 1997. A joint written appeal by the College and the Academy was made to Dr Kwa Soon Bee, Permanent Secretary (Health)/Director of Medical Services, to extend the lease for another ten years. Chairman said that the Ministry was willing to extend the lease for another 3 years. The lease of the Postgraduate Medical Library would be expiring soon. Chairman would like the House to discuss this as well.

College's 25th Anniversary

The College had turned 25 this year since its formation in 1971. The Council would like to commemorate the 25th anniversary this year but the present 15th Council (1995-1997) had proposed to hold the celebrations next May in conjunction with the next Scientific Conference. Chairman said that to commemorate the occasion, a CD-ROM on the history of the College is being considered.

Before the commencement on the next item on the Agenda, that is, the Minutes of the 24th AGM, Chairman apologised to the House that owing to the wrong computer disc being given to the printer, the printed Minutes of the 24th Annual General Meeting in the 25th AGM Report (1995-1996) from pages 3 to 12 were actually the draft copy and not the final Minutes. Amended copies of the Minutes of the 24th Annual General Meeting were distributed to those present.

1 MINUTES OF THE 24TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY, 27 MAY 1995

The following amendments to the Minutes were adopted :

Page 6, Line 5, under 'Old' members

To add the surname "Ng" to Dr Richard Ng's name.

Page 11, Para 6.3, Line 3

To cancel the word 'of' and S\$ 750,000 should be in brackets.

The amended paragraph, 6.3, should read as " Dr Alfred Loh, being the alternate Chairman of the Postgraduate Medical Library, then proposed to the House that should the Library Committee decide to cease operating the Library, then the College would like to use half of the donated funds (S\$ 750,000) to expand the College's Library. It would be known as the College's Postgraduate Library in Family Medicine and be merged with the present Reuben Meyer Library".

Dr Lee Suan Yew brought up a point about the use of the funds of the Postgraduate Medical Library should the Library Committee decide to cease operations of the Library. He said that according to the Postgraduate Medical Library - Memorandum of Understanding, all unused funds should first be donated back to charity. This was noted by the House.

The adoption of the Minutes of the 24th Annual General Meeting was proposed by Dr Lawrence Ng and seconded by Dr Yii Hee Seng. There were no objections.

2 MATTERS ARISING

2.1 Advanced Training in Family Medicine (AST) Programme

Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan informed the House that the Minister of Health in his meeting with the School of Postgraduate Medical Studies, NUS, had said that some time should be spent to consolidate the Family Medicine programme. The Minister had no objections however that the College runs an Advanced Training Programme.

The AST programme has not been implemented as yet as Professor Goh wanted a clearer direction before he proceeds further. He informed the House that during the past one year, the College's Research Committee has conducted research activities. One of the pillars of the AST programme was that the AST trainees will complete three original research projects, that is, one project for each year. Associate Professor Goh will work out the implementation of the programme.

2.2 Postgraduate Medical Library

Chairman informed the House that the MOH is very short of space. With the arrival of the new Permanent Secretary (Health) Mr Koh Yong Guan, in June 1996, to understudy Dr Kwa Soon Bee, who will be leaving the Ministry in September 1996, the Ministry had asked the College to give up its present Computer Room to accommodate Dr Daniel Leong and his staff temporarily. Also, the Medical Audit Accreditation Unit (MAAU) which is presently temporarily located at the National Skin Centre has to vacate its office as the NSC needs that space for its further development plans.

With the urgent need of space by the Ministry, Chairman would foresee that the Postgraduate Medical Library will not be at the Mezzanine floor anymore. Its Library Committee would be meeting early next month to discuss how and where to relocate if the Library continues to operate. Chairman said that previously he had proposed to Professor Chao Tzee Cheng, the then Master of the Academy on the possibility of turning the Postgraduate Medical Library into a Reference Library for the Family Medicine trainees. The new Library, which could be named as 'Postgraduate Medical Library for Family Medicine', would be housed in the College premises. It would then be properly stocked with the latest medical journals and updated with the latest information technology, so that members could just pay a fee to have the materials they might want. A qualified and trained Librarian or Library Technician would be employed to serve full-time in the new Library.

2.3 Compulsory SMC-CME Programme

The House discussed compulsory CME and suggested that the College Council bring the following discussions to the Chairman, SMC-CME Committee:

2.3.1 Make CME programmes structured

At the moment, CME programmes are largely unstructured. It was suggested that structured courses that meet the general practitioners/family physicians needs be developed.

2.3.2 Reduce the CME accreditation points

In order to encourage more doctors' participation in CME programmes, it was felt that the present 25 CME points per year may not be attainable for some practising doctors because of their very busy schedules (family, professional practice). Reducing it by 50% to 12 CME points per year was suggested.

2.3.3 Taskforce to study the CME patterns of doctors

Associate Professor Goh would like to propose that the College reply to the SMC-CME Committee for a period of 3 to 6 months to be given to study CME undertaken by doctors. We need to know the pattern of CME participation before considering making it compulsory.

2.4 College Premises

The following suggestions were made by the House :

- * The College would take up the offer by the Minister of Health for statutory powers so that its financial and premises problems could be taken care of. However, with the conversion to statutory powers, the present College will have to dissolve itself and a new College be formed. The composition of College members appointed should include representations from the MOH and the NUS.
- * Use the present College's reserves to buy an old shop-house for its Secretariat office only, with no Lecture rooms. Some reserves must be set aside for operating purposes.

In order to know the definition of 'statutory powers', the House proposed that Chairman ask a member of the Attorney General's Chambers to give a talk to the College members on 'statutory powers', its pros and cons.

Chairman suggested that though this Annual General Meeting did not have enough quorum for voting to decide on the issue of “statutory powers”, he would like to have a feel of the sentiments of the House. The votes showed that

13 members were ‘for’ statutory powers
5 members were ‘against’ statutory powers
3 members abstained

3 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FIFTEENTH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1996

3.1 REPORT OF THE FIFTEENTH COUNCIL 1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

The Report of the Fifteenth Council for the year ended 31 March 1996 was presented.

The following amendments were recorded:

Sub-para 2.7.1, line 1.

Word “Workshop” should be amended to “Workgroup”.

Dr Lee Suan Yew mentioned that for many years, the number of Fellows has remained at 15. He wanted to know whether there would be a possibility of increasing the number. Chairman agreed with Dr Lee that during the next Annual General Meeting, nominations would be filed for members who had contributed significantly to the College to be appointed by the Censors Board and awarded the Fellowship.

3.2 REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CENSORS 1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

Members went through the Report without any objections.

3.3 REPORT OF THE CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE 1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

The following amendment was made:

Seminars/Symposium

Commas should be used after 'Knocks' and 'Bone'

The amended sentence should read as :

6/5/95 Management of Orthopaedic Conditions
Sporting Knocks, Bone, and Joint Trauma

Chairman commended Dr Richard Ng for his consistent and dedicated services as being both Honorary Treasurer and Chairman of the Continuing Medical Education Committee for the period under review.

3.4 REPORT OF THE FAMILY MEDICINE TEACHING PROGRAMME 1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

Dr James Chang would like to know why College members who had assisted in the Postgraduate Family Medicine clinical postings were not recorded anywhere in the College's Annual Report.

Associate Professor Goh apologised for the oversight on his part in omitting the names of the College members who had offered invaluable assistance as trainers in the Postgraduate Family Medicine clinical postings.

Dr Soh Cheow Beng would like to know how many MOH/PPS trainees currently doing the M. Med (Family Medicine) are our members. He stressed the importance of them being in the College's fraternity for continuity. Associate Professor Goh said that the number of trainees who are members of the College are only a handful. He will continue to encourage new members to join.

3.5 REPORT OF THE UNDERGRADUATE TEACHING PROGRAMME 1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

Chairman informed the House that the College had continued to work with the NUS, Department of Community, Occupational and Family Medicine (COFM) in teaching Family Medicine to our undergraduates.

3.6 REPORT OF THE RESEARCH COMMITTEE 1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

Chairman commended Dr Lee Kheng Hock, Chairman, Undergraduate Committee for revitalising the Research Committee for year under review.

Dr Lee informed the House that the College recently conducted a study on dietary habits of office workers in Singapore, sponsored by the Kellogg Foundation. He also informed the House that the College is now on the worldwide web page. Members were informed that the Sembawang Media has granted the College Web site on a trial basis. Doctors could subscribe to the College's membership through the Web page. The reference is [http\\: www.smed.com.sg.fps](http://www.smed.com.sg.fps).

3.7 REPORT OF THE PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE
1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

Chairman was happy to note that the backlog for the journal issues had been cleared. The Publications Committee had continued to produce issues up to date.

3.8 REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE
1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

The Report of the Finance Committee was presented to the House. The House commended the Finance Committee for keeping the finances healthy once more.

3.9 REPORT OF THE PRACTICE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE
1 April 1995 to 31 March 1996

The House was informed that the College had continued to build a good rapport with the HQ SAF Medical Corps. The latter had invited the College to be on its Board of Visitors.

4 AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1996

The following amendment was made :

Page 6, para 12a. Miscellaneous Income, Line 3

'Advertisement on annual report' should be read as : "Advertisement on annual report, journal and College Mirror

4.1 The House noted it had a small surplus for this fiscal year.

4.2 Dr Lim Kim Leong wanted to know why the sentence on page 5, on "the latter will be replaced as and when the need arises". Chairman explained that the painting and pottery in the College were actually technically on loan to us.

- 4.3 The House adopted Dr Paul Chan's suggestion on "VLF" Fellowship fund be written in full, that is, "Victor Loius Fernandez" Fellowship fund.

5 ANY OTHER MATTERS

Dr Lawrence Ng wanted to seek the views of the House on whether Family Medicine is a specialty. Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan assured him that Family Medicine is a "specialty". It is a specialty in breadth as opposed to depth in the other traditionally known hospital specialties.

Chairman and Dr Lee Suan Yew both assured Dr Lawrence Ng and members of the House that Family Medicine, is a "specialty". It is now up to the general practitioners/family physicians to treat their patients well without the need to charge them high fees. Slowly and surely, the medical circles including the patients would see that those general practitioners/family physicians, who had attained higher medical degree in Family Medicine, had done their medical practice well in treating patients without charging high fees.

There being no further matters, the meeting ended at 6.25 pm with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

2. COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

2.1 Study trip on Family Medicine to U.K. **(7th - 15th September 1996)**

A one week study trip was organised by the Ministry of Health, the School of Postgraduate Medical Studies, NUS and the College. The objectives of the trip were to study various aspects of primary health activities in the U.K., including quality assurance, auditing and medical computing in G.P. clinics, the role of trainers and trainees in postgraduate family medicine training, the provision of CME and the organisation of locum services. Visits were made to the Royal College of General Practitioners U.K., G.P. Link Office, several Health and Medical Centres and the Public Health Department. The College was represented by Dr Lim Lean Huat, Vice-President, and Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan, Censor-in-Chief. A full Report was submitted by Dr Lim Lean Huat.

2.2 Medical Technology Standards Committee, Singapore Productivity and Standards Board.

The College was represented on this Committee by Dr Yii Hee Seng, Council Member. The function of the Committee is to determine and monitor industry standards for various medical technology.

2.3 *SAF Board of Visitors.*

The College was invited to form a Board of Visitors to visit various SAF medical centres for the purpose of auditing their operations and to offer suggestions that will improve their standards of operation. Seven Council Members and one past Censor-in-Chief were co-opted as members of the Board for a period of one year.

2.4 *Harvard Medical International course on "Review of Internal Medicine For Family Physicians" (25th - 27th October 1996)*

Three Council Members were nominated for the "Roche Sponsorship" to attend the course which was offered through the SGH Postgraduate Medical Institute.

2.5 *College Web-Page on Internet.*

College is on the internet and has her own web-page through Sembawang Net. College will be looking into having her own internet address rather than through another internet provider.

2.6 *Official Visit to Myanmar and the 43rd Myanmar Medical Conference (14th - 19th January 1997)*

A delegation of 4 members from College together with members of the Singapore Medical Association participated in the official visit to Myanmar on the invitation of the Myanmar Medical Association (MMA) and the General Practice Section of the MMA. College President and Censor-in-Chief presented a paper on the '*Evolution of the College, WONCA and Family Medicine Undergraduate and Postgraduate Training Programme.*' They also met with the Myanmar Deputy Minister for Health during the visit and was invited to assist in the development of a Family Medicine training programme for Myanmar. Ministry of Health (MOH) was informed of this visit before-hand and a full Report on the Myanmar Visit was compiled and submitted to the MOH for information.

2.7 *Re-organisation of College Premises.*

College President had a meeting with the new Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health on the expiry of our lease in March 1997, and the reorganisation of the College premises in preparation for the renewal of the lease at the current commercial rate of S\$30.00 per square metre (approximately S\$3.00 per square foot) from April 1997. College will give up the lecture theatre, and swap the computer room presently

occupied by MOH with the library space. This will reduce our office space to 2412 square feet from a total of 4460 square feet that we are presently occupying.

2.8 Closure of the Postgraduate Medical Library

The Postgraduate Medical Library Committee met in January 1997 and agreed to officially close the library on 28th February 1997. The fund of about S\$1.5 million as well as other fixed assets will be divided equally between the Academy of Medicine and College. A Postgraduate Family Medicine Library Fund will be set up with the S\$750,000/-. About S\$50,000/- of this fund will be used to renovate and upgrade the new library while the interest accrued from the remaining S\$700,000/- will be used to maintain the library.

2.9 Visit to the College by Myanmar Deputy Minister for Health, H.E. Col Dr Than Zin - (28th February 1997)

Col Dr Than Zin, Myanmar Deputy Minister for Health, accompanied by the Counsellor, Embassy of the Union of Myanmar, Mr Myint Soe, visited College on 28th February 1997 to meet and further discuss the development of a family medicine training programme for Myanmar. The meeting was also attended by the President and Honorary Secretary of the Singapore Medical Association. Myanmar will send a delegation of five doctors to attend our forthcoming Scientific Conference and a pre-conference programme will be organised for them to visit our primary health care facilities and hospitals.

3.0 25th Anniversary cum 6th Scientific Conference & 7th Meditech Exhibition - (24th - 25th May 1997)

The organising committee has been working on this auspicious event of the College since June 1996 and it promises to be a memorable occasion. The theme for the Scientific Conference is "**Excellence in Family Medicine**". Dr Charles Boelen, Chief Medical Officer at the World Health Organisation will be the keynote speaker on the topic : "**The Five Star Doctor: An Asset to Health Care Reform?**", while Dr Goran Sjonell, President of the World Organisation of Family Doctors (WONCA) will deliver the Sreenivasan Oration entitled "**Organised Family Medicine - the Key Issue to Cost-Effective Healthcare**". Dr Aline Wong, Senior Minister of State for Health and the Environment will officiate at the opening ceremony.

3. **MEMBERSHIP**

The Asia-Pacific Regional Study on dietary habits of the urban population in Asian countries was completed in 1996. This study did not include children and infants. It was felt that the dietary habits of this segment of the population is perhaps of greater importance. A study to look into the dietary habits of Singaporean children aged between 4 months to 4 years was planned. We hope to obtain a sample size of 600. The study will be done with the assistance of 2 consultant dieticians. The project is currently at the pilot study stage. If successful, we hope to interest our colleagues in the Asia-Pacific region to undertake a similar study so that comparisons may be made.

The College web page that was started in 1995 ran into several problems. Firstly, the URL (Uniform Resource Locator) <http://www.smedia.com.sg/fps> was too long. Secondly, the intention to develop it further was curtailed because of policy and personnel changes in our sponsors. Various other alternatives were explored. It was decided that we should re-launch the project on our own effort and we would engage professional help when necessary. We plan to have a newsgroup-styled forum page where members can log on to post or respond to messages from other members. The page would be moderated and restricted to members with passwords. We hope that this would stimulate interaction among our members. Members could also keep each other informed of the latest developments in the practice of family medicine in Singapore. We also hope to be able to put our journal on line. One of the most exciting prospect is to have CME on line. We may no longer need to depend so heavily on drug-company sponsored CME events. In the near future, members may be able to read our journal, answer a multiple-choice question based on the articles and submit their answers electronically. This would be marked and the scores of the respondents would be kept in a database. This may be the solution to the problem of encouraging busy family

physicians' participation in CME. They may be able to do so in the comfort of their homes and offices. Most important of all, they can do so at a convenient time in their busy daily schedule. We can also ensure the quality of the CME programme by putting only the best and the most relevant articles from our journal.

While there are many interesting and exciting projects planned, the difficulty of finding members with sufficient free time to participate in these activities remain. Perhaps this is the price we pay for making family physicians work long hours in an excessively competitive and cost-conscious environment. More effort should be made in the coming year to encourage our colleagues to participate in our research activities.

REPORT OF PRACTICE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Chairman of the committee represented the College in the Medical Standards Technology Committee of the Standards Council, Productivity and Standards Board. This Committee evaluates standards for medical equipment, including prosthesis and heart valves.

A Working Group has also been formed to look into Medical Informatics, in particular Electronic Medical Records and College is represented in this Working Group by Dr Lee Kheng Hock.

We have also assisted the Singapore Armed Forces in the following :

- 1) Review of Drug Lists - The SAF had requested feedback on their present inventory of drugs and surgical items available in their medical centres. A sub-committee comprising Dr Alfred Loh, A/Prof Goh Lee Gan, Dr Lim Lean Huat and Dr Yii Hee Seng was formed to review these items and suggestions and feedback were submitted to the SAF.
- 2) SAF Board of Visitors - 8 members of the College were nominated by the College, and were accepted by the SAF, to the Board of Visitors. Teams of 2-3 members from the Board would then conduct visits to the various Medical Centres together with the Senior Medical Officer (Health Care) from the HQ Medical Corp, SAF. They would inspect the Medical Centres and provide feedback and suggestions for improvement on design and operations of the various Medical Centres. To date, the teams have visited SAFTI Military Institute and Nee Soon Medical Centres and the programme will be on-going.
- 3) Visit to the Medical Classification Centre - A visit was arranged for members to get acquainted with the new Physical Employment Status (PES) grading system. This was to allow Family Physicians to be familiar with the system and to allow better understanding when our patients go for National Service.

Through these programmes, we hope to foster a closer relationship with the SAF and are looking at systems that will allow the continuity of care between Family Physicians and the doctors in the SAF.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

The accounts of the College showed an operational deficit of \$45,839.00 for the year, in contrast to a net income of \$60,349.00 for the previous year.

Gross income for the year was actually an increase of 3.2% (i.e. \$8,221.00) to \$266,866.00 as compared to the previous year's income of \$258,645.00. However, the major portion of this income came from advanced payment of registration fees for the forthcoming conference as well as from fixed-deposit interests, but is unfortunately offset to the amount of \$34,990.00 by delayed payment of subscription by members.

Our expenditure of \$312,705.00 for the year, was 58% higher than the previous year. This was due to a deliberate effort to expense the accumulated income earned during the past two years to avoid taxation. An amount of \$30,000.00 was allocated to the purchase of new journals and books, another \$30,000.00 to the purchase of surgical training materials (surgical models), and \$70,000.00 to renovation and upgrading of the College office.

The College no longer enjoy the exclusive role of CME provider and hence no longer depend on income from this source. There is also a substantial drop in administrative fees collected for mailing promotional materials from other organisations to members in the face of competition from other larger medical organisations.


